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Late Assignments: ELEVEN (11) points deducted EACH DAY from the assignment due date. After FOUR days a student can receive a maximum of 50% for the assignment. Late work will ONLY be accepted during the current 4.5-week marking period. After the grade marking period ends, all grades will automatically be calculated as a ZERO.

Make-up Policy: Student has **ONE (1)** day per day(s) absent (**excused only**) to make up assignment(s) with no point deduction. Make-up work submitted AFTER the due date will fall into the late work category. For unexcused absences, the policy for late assignments will be implemented.

Test Retakes: Students are also allowed to retake one summative assessment of their choice per semester. Reassessment MUST be completed within the current 4.5 grade marking period. The reassessment grade will be taken as new grade for record.

Cheating: Student will receive a ZERO for the assignment AFTER the parent is contacted.

Absences: Students must have an admit slip from the front office in order to return to class following an absence.
